# COSC – Devon Marshall

-We had our second COSC meeting of the year on Nov 3. There were 33 people in attendance. One of EIPS' longtime focuses has been advocating for the Govt to replace Sherwood Heights' building. If you have friends who's kids go there, I'd recommend asking them what it's like. It is the largest Jr High in EIPS and has the smallest gym. Some classes have to do gym in a classroom. Their heating system is so old they can't get parts for it. Teachers arrive early to open their classrooms to hopefully get warmer air in before students arrive. When they do arrive most students are wearing their winter jackets and gloves in their class. Heights' School Council is hoping our community will join them in advocating for these kids. There is a website www.replacesherwoodheights.ca that we will post on our Facebook page with ideas and info for how we as a community can support these kids.

We had a presentation from the RCMP as they are focusing this year on building public trust & confidence through engagement and relationship building. For those that helped last month at Hot lunch, you would have met our new SRO. Officers are becoming more active in our schools and as well as school patrols (speed enforcement around schools, traffic etc). At that time, they had

completed over 1,000 school patrols to date.

We discussed pooling our \$500 AB grant money for parent engagement together in hopes of getting a greater return on what we'd be able to offer parents at our schools and community.

Our ATA President shared teachers concerns about the new curriculum, which we will be discussing at greater length in this meeting.

And Associate Superintendent Stoddard presented and discussed Assurance Review with us at length which we will also be highlighting in this meeting.

# Ryan shares

Too much, too fast; slow down of the roll out is needed

- this will be a challenged for the teachers for sure (For example, partners for Science will all need to be recreated)
- too many outcomes (for example, currently Gr. 1 LA has 96 and the new one has 273)
- No standard over the grades (where is the grade differential?)
- the government needs feedback based on the gap in COVID knowledge and the gap in the new curriculum
- We need to email Nate Glubish and Jordan Walker(MLA's) and fill out surveys, contact the minister of education and Jason Kenney

- We need to ask for a slow down of the roll out; we don't want this curriculum to negatively affect our kids
