#### Strathcona Christian Academy Elementary

- Review and revise current reading best practices
- Collaborate with EIPS literacy consultant to discern district direction and initiatives
- Continued implementation of the Leveled Literacy Intervention program in Division I, book clubs and guided reading groups.
- Continued implementation of Reader's Workshop in grades 2-6, UFLI in grades 1-2 and Bug Morphology Kits in grade 3
- Implementation of Dibels reading assessment Grades 2-5.
- Offer literacy supports to parents (home reading, Grade 1 Parent Literacy Night)
- Dedicated PL Time to collaborate about English Language Arts & Literature Scope and Sequence and best practices
- Purposeful use of technology to engage students and enhance literacy at school and at home (Epic Kids, Study Ladder, other websites and apps)
- Ensure a variety of books at multiple levels are available for students in the classroom and library as they develop and challenge themselves as readers
- Celebrate EIPS Read In Week in October
- Guest readers/authors during SCA Reading Day in March
- Invite EIPS literacy consultants to provide professional development in classrooms to model, coach or provide support
- Creating engaging school reading activities based out of the school library such as Reading Incentives/Rewards, Design a Bookmark, Junior High student guest readers, Story Book Character Dress-Up Day
- Grade 1-3 home reading program promoting daily reading at home
- A variety of formative and summative assessment strategies will be used such as:
- o Observations, conversations and products
- o Non-permanent vertical surfaces
- o Rubrics
- o Tests and quizzes

#### **Strategy**

- Update SCA Elementary mathematics framework guiding document for all teachers
- Update Common Terms posters/visuals
- Teachers will continue to access the EIPS new curriculum instructional materials designed to support the implementation of the new curriculum.
- Purposefully use technology to enhance math programming and differentiation
- Use math manipulatives in all grades and across all math strands
- Create numeracy-rich environments in classrooms (e.g., math word walls, visuals, number lines) and around the public areas of the school
- Participate in the EIPS Week of Inspirational Math
- Explicitly teach and regularly assess foundational math skills
- Fact Fluency is taught through a multi-layered approach: e.g., Games, visual aids, warm-ups, real-world applications, manipulatives, patterns, etc.
- Practice is modeled, shared, guided and independent

#### **Strategy**

- Continued growth of grade 4 prayer club a voluntary group of students who learn how to pray and who pray for the school.
- Continue Library Leadership program an opportunity for grade 6 students to help in the library on a regular basis.
- Establish the SCE Student Leadership Club/Student Council. The leadership club could provide insight to the principal, plan some school events and look for ways to provide leadership to other students in the school.
- Establish buddy classes throughout the entire school (e.g., Grade 1 with Grade 4, Grade 2 with Grade 5, Grade 3 with Grade 6)
- SCE Missions find local opportunities where students can serve and tour different organizations connected with SCE (e.g., Basically Babies, Mustard Seed etc.)
- Expand student leadership in planning and implementation of school chapels
- Create student hot lunch team to assist parent volunteers with hot lunch rollout
- Be good neighbours to the residents in the new residential area behind the school (e.g., Christmas cards, collection drives etc.)
